The EUPeace Research Hubs

Four Research Hubs shape the EUPeace Research Landscape and provide the central organisational framework for the Network.

Security & Conflict Transformation

The aim of the Research Hub is to develop a integrative approach relating to all stages of the conflict cycle, from conflict prevention and security to escalation and transformation. It is based on an understanding of peace and security as the absence of violence and justice and inclusivity.

Migration & Human Rights

The Research Hub aims to re-examine European migration history and its impact on society from an economic, social and political perspective and the implications for peace, justice and inclusivity.

One of its goals is to form policy recommendations.

Climate Science & Just Transition

The Research Hub aims to strengthen research in climate science and environmental justice, and better understand Europe's current conflict dynamics related to climate change.

Inclusive Health & Well-Being

The Research Hub aims to promote health and prevent diseases, understand environmental and socio-economic risk factors in the EU and partner countries, strengthen disease management and health systems resilience, ensure equitable access to health services through dialogue, and enhance data collection and interpretation through digital solutions.
